Countermeasure for Anaphylaxis Using EpiPen®

- I. If a person in possession of an EpiPen® (adrenaline self-injector) sufferes from an anaphylaxis (severe allergic reaction), the person will inject the EpiPen for himself/herself. If you encountered such a situation during class or on campus, please provide the following support.
 - (1) Depending on the progress of the symptoms, the EpiPen holder* may not be able to inject himself/herself. In such a case, you should administer the injection for the patient.
 - (2) Although the symptoms will remarkably improve shortly after the EpiPen injection, call an ambulance (119) as further treatments would be necessary.
 - * If the person is unable clearly to indicate that he/she holds an EpiPen (difficult to express his/her intention), you may become aware of it from situations, such as the person grabs hold of an EpiPen, the person is trying to search his/her bag (for an EpiPen), etc.
- 2. Remove the blue safety cap from the EpiPen (see figures), press the orange tip vertically against the skin slightly outside of the thigh until it "clicks" (can be done through clothing), and hold for 5 seconds. When the EpiPen is removed after injection, the needle tip automatically retracts into the cover.
